# **International Graduate Entrepreneur Application Guide Changes**

#### As of February 26, 2024

- Applications are only accepted online at novascotia.ca/ensnp.
- ➤ We're switching to the 2021 version of the National Occupational Classification (NOC). This means that:
  - the NOC 2016 skill type and skill level structure (NOC 0, A, B, C and D) will be replaced with a 6-category system representing the training, education, experience and responsibilities (TEER) needed to work in an occupation.
  - 4-digit occupation codes will become 5-digit codes.
- The guide has been updated with Immigration and Population Growth's new address.

#### As of Sept. 21, 2020

- > Joint ventures between NSNP program applicants are eligible.
- > Financial Statement Review Service Providers replace Audit Service Verifiers.

# As of Oct. 24, 2017

➤ The age limit of a dependent child has increased from "under 19" to "under 22". Those who are 22 years of age or older and who are unable to support themselves due to a physical or mental condition continue to be eligible as a dependent.
