

Nova Scotia Demand: Express Entry Application Guide Changes

As of Nov. 16, 2018

- A one-time re-issuance of a nomination may be granted on a case-by-case basis.

As of July 10, 2018

- The When Not to Apply section has been updated and no longer excludes applicants who are:
 - the spouse of an international student at a Canadian post-secondary institution who is not in his/her last academic year of studies.

As of April 27, 2018

- Five occupations have been removed from the list of targeted occupations in Nova Scotia Demand: Express Entry (Category B):
 - Information systems analysts and consultants, NOC 2171
 - Computer programmers and interactive media developers, NOC 2174
 - Computer network technicians, NOC 2281
 - User support technicians, NOC 2282
 - Financial sales representatives, NOC 6235

As of Dec. 4, 2017

- All references to the National Occupational Classification (NOC) are now to the 2016 version of the NOC (<http://noc.esdc.gc.ca/English/NOC/Welcome.aspx?ver=16>); not to the NOC 2011 version.

As of Oct. 24, 2017

- The age limit of a dependent child has increased from “under 19” to “under 22”. Those who are 22 years of age or older and who are unable to support themselves due to a physical or mental condition continue to be eligible as a dependent.
